## Jersey Chairman's Report 2016

After last year's period of change and organising of lectures, this year the committee has been settle and been able to focus other areas. We had our inaugural discussion panel event which was a great successful. Promoting of CIGPE in schools has improved this year.

#### Lectures

There were seven lectures this year, which had been organised by the Jersey Committee. All lectures were very interesting and our attendance figures were up on last year, with over 500 people attending our events. This included a steady number of guests for dinner before the lecture, which continues to be a popular event for local engineers to network with each other and speakers. We thank our regular supporters at the dinners, Geomarine, JE and Rothwells.

Unfortunately 1 lecture had to be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances with the speaker, but we were able to fill in with a local speaker who gave a talk on the new electric power cable from France to Jersey. This proved to be a very popular lecture and was kindly sponsored by the JE.

Next year's lectures have been organised by our colleagues in Guernsey which are summarised below. We are awaiting confirmation on a couple of lectures and fliers will be issued shortly.

#### Other Events

In September this year we were fortunate to have the ICE Director General, Nick Baveystock, visit the Channel Island. This inspired us to host our inaugural discussion panel event which was supported by local Law firm Cary Olsen, who provided an adjudicator as well as finical support. This enabled us to hold the event with first class facilities. A keynote speaker, Duncan Botting, an expert in Smart cities was over from the UK. The panel also included Doug Bannister (PoJ), Dave Padfield (JE) and Colin Buesnel (AJA). The presentations and subsequent discussion on smart technology was interesting and engaging and we received some very positive feedback after the event.

The Director General also visited local ICE members at various events during the day. A meet and greet, site visit and a presentation to attendees at a workshop were all well received.

A workshop for ICE members looking at gaining professional members was also organised by South West membership manager Michelle Cockburn. This was very well attended and provided valuable to the local ICE members looking to progress with their professional membership. It is hoped this will become a regular event, and also to make ties with the other engineering bodies to host similar event. In 2017, this will be focused on by the committee.

#### Schools / Career Promotion

This year we had an increase in interest from the schools from September. We put this down to a change in personnel at education who has been very enthusiastic in engaging the schools and promoting our lectures. In the four lectures we had from September we had nearly 100 students attend. We hope this engagement with students continues into 2017.

CIGPE had a stand at the Jersey Skills Show again this year, a large scale career event held at Fort Regent. Working with the Jersey Construction Council, Architects Association, the construction industry had a large presence and the event was well attended and a great success. This event will now be a permeant fixture in the education department's calendar with CIGPE continuing to be involved. Some funds in this year's budget will be allocated to purchasing interactive display items for this event and other school careers days.

Initial discussions have been started with Highlands College with a view to establishing a curriculum for engineering courses that will suit the local needs. This is being led by the college with input from CIGPE and JeCC.

#### Finances

The finances are looking healthy with extra funding has been secured to enable us to host another question time as well as some other potential events. Unfortunately at time of writing the accounts have not yet been audited, although there appears to be no issue with the accounts. The treasurers report will be issued in due course.

### Website/communications

Our website has been a useful tool this year with many new members signing up through the website, and communications happening through the website. Some more work could still be done to utilise the website to manage emailing of fliers etc. In summary, this year has been a successful year for CIGPE, with new members, increased attendance, and the success of discussion panel event. We hope to build on this in 2017, and have some work to do with organising the lectures for 2018.

I would like to thank all the committee members for their hard work over the year, and continued support. Hopefully this work will be bearing fruits in the coming years as more young people look to a career in engineering, having been inspired by something they have seen via CIGPE and the wider engineering community in Jersey.
